During September and October there will be temporary reception points for recycling garden waste and electrical equipment at four locations in Bromley. Details are available on the noticeboard at the back of church.

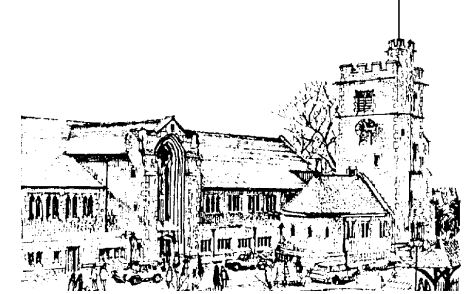
