

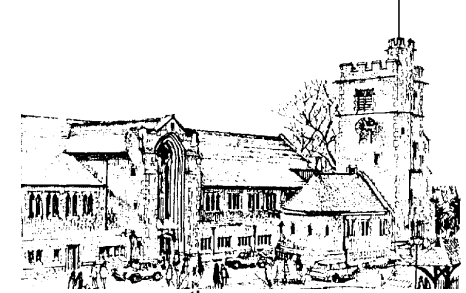
Children's Society **Cheese & Wine Party** is on Friday 10th October at 8.00 pm. Please do come along and support the Children's society.
