Inclusive Church - The promised congregational meeting to discuss the Inclusive Church declaration will take place on Sunday 26 September between 4pm and 5.30pm. This touches on some of the most important issues facing the Church at the present time. Do come and join in - listen and have your say. Here's the declaration to remind you "We affirm that the Church's mission, in obedience to Holy Scripture, is to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in every generation. We acknowledge that this is Good News for people regardless of their sex, race or sexual orientation. We believe that, in order to strengthen the Gospel's proclamation of justice to the world; and for the greater glory of God, the Church's own common life must be justly ordered. To that end, we call on our Church live out the promise of the Gospel; to celebrate the diverse gifts of all members of the body of: Christ; and, in the ordering of our common life to open the ministries of deacon, priest and bishop to those so called to serve by God, regardless of their sex, race or sexual orientation"
