Improvements: (Report 3)

Work is now underway to refurbish the Kitchens and Toilets and to build an Accessible Toilet in the old Traidcraft Store. Outside, there will be work on the tower; a shallow ramp will be built to the Parish Office door; and there will be improvements to the car park at the east end of the church. Repairs will also be made to the church bells.

The Church Rooms have now been handed over to the main contractors, Theobald's Ltd. of Gravesend, and the Link door has been locked. This is essential for security and safety reasons. For a time, the only church toilet facilities will be those opposite the Church Office and those in the Youth Centre. However, as work on the Toilets is completed, we shall be given access to them. Inevitably, there will be digging and disruption in and around the Church Rooms, and some disturbance of the car parking arrangements. You have our assurance that we shall do our best to keep all these effects to a minimum, and keep you informed. Ernest Yeo. Churchwarden.
