GOLDEN JUBILEE. 2007 is Golden Jubilee year for BPC - the Church was consecrated on 14 December 1957 and we're planning six months of celebrations beginning with the Patronal Festival on 29 June and culminating on the Golden Jubilee day itself. There will be special services, concerts, specially composed new music; a gala Festival dinner and also some activities which will reach outwards in mission. "Jubilee" is first and foremost about justice so attention to some of the injustices in the world will also be at the heart of our Festival we shall seek both to learn and to act to promote God's justice.
