40th Anniversary

Bromley Y celebrates 40 years of service to young people in Bromley this year. The beginnings go right back to a coffee bar in the High Street, now Bella Pasta, run by Ken Burnett, who made a room available to young people who congregated there (so his other customers could have their refreshments in peace?). He shared his concerns with Ken Addis of the ABC Youth Club run by central Bromley churches, and funding was obtained from the YWCA to set up a Project. Bromley Parish Church, the Central Methodist Church and others, were involved right from the beginning. For those with long memories, people particularly involved were Dr. Joyce Brown and Joy James and later Jonathan Latter. Vicars of Bromley served on the Management Committee and David Bartleet was Chairman at a particularly difficult time for Bromley Y, as we became independent from the YWCA, and found more suitable premises in Ethelbert Road.

We have a lot to celebrate – it is unusual for a small local charity to keep going for so long, we have grown from strength to strength, always responding quickly to changing needs, and we are now highly respected in the community for providing an innovative and effective service.

As the Church here has always been so supportive, I thought it right to share with you some of the ideas we have to celebrate. Any other suggestions are welcome! We hope to have several small events both to raise our profile and to raise funds. These are likely to include a concert of some sort and an Open Afternoon. We hope to get some of the young people to produce art work or writing to display. We would like to involve schools (eg. own-clothes days). There will be a Raffle. A definite date is a Sponsored Walk on Saturday 24 September – watch this space!
