Following on from the previous answer I like the welcome. I find the caring and concern for young children very attractive. Church and lay readers are pretty good on the whole.

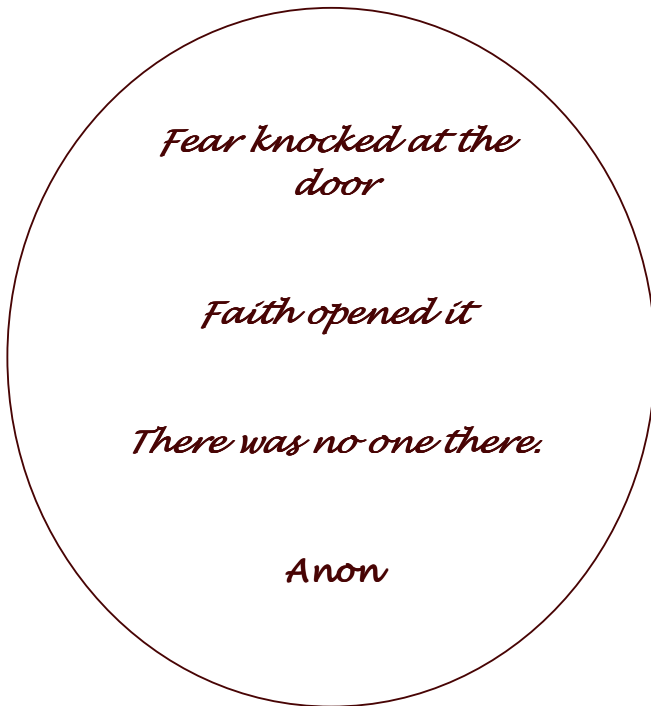
**Is there any part of BPC that you feel could be seriously improved on?**
