

Improvements

By the time you read this, the builders will have begun to refurbish the Kitchens and Toilets and to build an Accessible Toilet in the old Traidcraft Store. Outside, there will be work on the tower; a shallow ramp will be built to the Parish Office door; and there will be improvements to the car park at the east end of the church. Repairs will also be made to the church bells.

Initially, the Church Rooms will be given over entirely to the main contractors, Theobald's Ltd. of Gravesend, and the Link door will be locked. This is essential for security and safety reasons.

After the service on Sunday mornings, for a few weeks, coffee, tea and squash will be served in the Youth Centre. For a time too, the only church toilet facilities will be those opposite the Church Office and those in the Youth Centre.

However, as work on the Rooms is completed, we shall be given access to them. Inevitably, there will be digging and disruption in and around them, and some disturbance of the car parking arrangements. We shall do our best to keep all these effects to a minimum, and keep you informed.
