

Sunday School Themes

Infant, Junior and Senior Sunday School all use course material called "Seasons of the Spirit". This course links in with the Revised Common Lectionary. The focus this term is mainly on the ministry of Jesus as recorded in the gospel of Mark. We explore what it means to listen to the voice of Wisdom and share in Jesus' ministry. Everything lays a foundation for the final Sunday of this term when we celebrate Christ the King.
