You've seen the posters, you've delivered the leaflets, you've read about it in the Diocesan Link and the last few editions of The Key: now it's nearly here!

Why is **Come, Taste, See** an important event? Because:

- 1) We are outlining the bold steps of faith which led to the setting up of the Christian church in this part of England. Costumed characters will tell the story.
- 2) We are inviting school children and members of the public to enter our church buildings. This in itself is an unusual event.
- 3) It is therefore an opportunity for others to experience an event which tells of God's story in the past – and now. Because you are part of God's continuing story on earth today.

Sharing our faith

If you feel that direct evangelism to complete strangers is not for you, perhaps you will feel more comfortable with what we are organising for the Come, Taste, See weekend:

- an invitation to the public to enter a building used for worship week by week
- the telling of a story which is true
- a Christian presence here in Bromley. You are part of that Christian presence!

Action now

Everyone can pray. We cannot expect God to bless our efforts without prayer. It seems to be a pattern; we know not how, that when many people pray, God is able to bring about good things – his blessing. It may be that through the weekend God will bring about things we have not even imagined. However, it is our duty to pray.

Please pray that:

- people will **come** to visit the exhibition
- they will **taste** of God's goodness
- they will **see** something of God in the members of the congregation

Here is the outline of the three days:

Friday 17 September

- Primary school groups and members of the public visit the exhibition

Saturday 18 September

- In addition to the exhibition the tower will be open.
